IN MEMORY OF



Nikitas "Nick" Tripodes, 61, passed away peacefully on June 4, 2017, at his home in South Pasadena surrounded by his family.

Nick was born in Alhambra on January 13, 1956 to Jack and Mary Tripodes, both Greek immigrants who had moved to California after starting their family in Cleveland. By far the youngest of his siblings and cousins, Nick was deeply loved by his extended family. The adoration was mutual and Nick developed a lifelong commitment to his family as well as to the larger Greek–American community. He was active in numerous organizations, including Saint Anthony Greek Orthodox Church, AHEPA, the Greek Heritage Society of Southern California, and the Pan-Icarian Brotherhood, a fraternal organization of Greeks from his ancestral island of Icaria.

Nick lived his whole life in South Pasadena and he had fond childhood memories of attending Saturday matinees at the Rialto, graduating from South Pasadena High School, and working during summers at Gus's BBQ, the family's business.

He graduated from the University of Southern California with a bachelor's degree in anthropology and he later attended the university's School of Dentistry. Nick established his dental practice in Pasadena where he took great pride in the care he provided to his patients throughout his 36-year-long career. He will



be remembered by his patients, many of whom became lifelong friends, for his sense of humor, positive attitude, and gentle technique.

Nick met his wife, Dena, while both were serving on the parish board of Saint Anthony Greek Orthodox Church in Pasadena. Nick and Dena were married in 1987. They purchased their home in South Pasadena adjacent to Nick's childhood home where his parents continued to live.

Nick was incredibly active in the Pan-Icarian Brotherhood where he was a lifelong member, an active officer of his local chapter, and a delegate to many of the annual conventions. He eventually became a board member of the Brotherhood's charitable organization, the Pan-Icarian Foundation, and was elected Foundation Chairman in 2014.

Nick was a deeply devoted father and cherished the time he spent with his family. He especially loved spending long weekends and vacations in Santa Barbara, which he considered his second home. He cultivated an appreciation for locally-sourced food and was a staple of Saturday farmers' markets in both Santa Barbara and Pasadena.

Nick is survived by his bride of almost 30 years, Dena; his children Zacharias, Marika, and Georgia; his sister Virginia Lappas and her family; his brother Peter; and many aunts, cousins, nieces, and nephews.

ICAROS UNBOUND

When my good friend and magazine publisher, Tom Costello, asked if I might want to contribute an article for his magazine, provided it was interesting, I jumped at the opportunity because I love to write. However, the interesting part was a sticking point since my favorite subjects, politics and dentistry, do not often leave my audiences enthralled. I am not a great storyteller, but this true life experience of mine has been requested and retold so many times that it must simply be a good story, (besides I've had more than forty years to hone it).

My father, William Contes, (Vasili Kontogiannis of Kountouma), left Ikaria at the age of six, and his family settled in Pittsburgh, PA. He married Henrietta Vassilaros and together they raised three sons, myself and my two brothers, John and Philip.

My story begins in 1972 when our dear father, a hard-working pharmacist who loved his family dearly, provided the means to send my brother John and I, unsupervised, back to his birthplace. Both in our early 20s, we explored Ikaria with many of our friends who had also made the trip for the annual Pan-Icarian Convention, which for the first time was taking place on the island.

One morning a group of us organized a boat (venzina) trip to the remote and beautiful beach of St. George (Agios Giorgis). About 30 of us packed food and wine and slowly chugged our way to this idyllic beach, whereupon I immediately led a group of us around the rocks to spearfish for octopus. When my friends swam back to the beach, I continued on, thinking that by swimming around the rocks I would find another way to access the beach. No such luck, as I could find no egress. The further I swam to find a beach where I could return to our group by land, the more that swimming back seemed out of the question, as surely there had to be a beach right around the bend.

Soon I was swimming past cliffs, and as I circumnavigated one rock, I found myself on the windward side of the island fighting waves where I could see no escape from the sea in the inlets. As I swam in the deep water I could see a hundred feet in each direction, including down. I then remembered the admonition of the merchant who sold me

my spear gun to, "watch out for sharks," which all of the sudden became a distinct possibility and led me to hum into my snorkel.

After three hours of continuous swimming, I finally came upon a seaside village, Agios Kyriaki. It almost seemed like a mirage to me as though I was in a Salvador Dalí painting. Although it was deserted, I hallucinated that I saw cows and nuns. As I clumsily made my way around the whitewashed one-story buildings in my fins and snorkel, a stocky, whitebearded gentleman with a cap and a pipe, resembling Ernest Hemingway, came around the corner and, quite astonished to see me, asked in Greek where I came from, ("Apo pou irthes?") In my broken Greek, I replied, "From America, (Ap tin Ameriki!")

After seeing the puzzled look on his face, I corrected myself, explaining our ill-fated picnic at St. George's beach.

I asked if he could show me the way to Faros, the village where the boat was to pick us up, since my friends most likely thought me dead, but he insisted on getting me something to eat first. I went back to his house and sat with him in his beautiful courtyard, while his wife brought us cheese, grapes, warm bread and a cold beer (a real rarity throughout our entire trip). He then gave me a pair of sandals and started me out on the path to Faros. His name was Nicholas, which suddenly occurred to me is the patron saint of sailors. I will never forget Nikolao Horiatis' kindness and generosity.

I arrived at Faros to find only one of our companions there, (Louis Andriotis of New York). Since he was not surprised to see me, I began to assume that no one had missed me. Actually, he had left shortly after me in order to find water, since we only remembered the wine. Close to sunset, however, our venzina chugged around the corner and the whole boat let out a whoop when they saw I was still alive. On our trip back they related to me how upset they

all were; somehow they managed to call out the coastguard and one of the girls, (Andrea Pamphilis of Atlanta), placed my sandals at the water's edge to commemorate what she believed were my last steps. By the time we returned to the main village, the whole island had assumed I had drowned, but quickly realized the rumors of my demise had been greatly exaggerated.

At our annual conventions, invariably someone asks me to recount this story, usually citing the time that I "swam around the island." In 2013, my wife, Judi, four of my five daughters and their boyfriends/husbands made the trip back to the island of my roots. On one of our adventures, we rented a boat, swam in the waters of St. George's Beach, and retraced my fateful swim - this time by boat. We all had an unforgettable two weeks enjoying the island, but my girls tell me that our trip to St. George's beach was the highlight.







My wife once boasted that she was FBI, "Full blooded Italian." To her bewilderment, I said, "I'm FBI, too...Full blooded Icarian." We both laughed

The 2-DAY EXPERIENTIAL CONFERENCE ON LONGEVITY is the first of its kind that is being organized in Ikaria. The purpose of the conference is to spread the idea of a happy long life, enjoyed by the Ikarian people, and to focus on their way of living, that could be beneficial for people around the world. Thus, the organizers believe that Ikaria can attract people from abroad that will discover a land of tranquility, spirituality and joy. This process will bring benefits to the Ikarian people and their economy.

Ikaria, due to its isolation, has been an arc of ancient Greek wisdom and old forms of living. Diet based on plants, mild movement in relation to nature, openness and togetherness in everyday life and in festivities seem to create a unique lifestyle. Most of all, their notorious relation to time is a way of valuing the present moment and never hurrying for the sake of "future".

The conference introduces the participants to a 5-Step Program to Longevity: meditation, diet, mild movement (in the water), siesta, and connecting (through theatre) as formulated by Angeliki Douka and Kyriaki Spanou who have encoded the Ikarian way of living into a program that is based on the energy of water and the healing power of theatre.

The program also includes a round table of lectures and discussions with distinguished guests including:

Nikos Afianes (from the Afianes wineries) will speak about the soil of Ikaria and in which way it contributes to antioxidant qualities in the grapes.

Christodoulos Stefanadis (Cardiologist, Head of Medical School of Athens) will speak about the findings of the research, by the Medical School of Athens, on Ikarian longevity.

Diane Kochilas (Well-known Greek food expert and award-winning author) will speak on the subject of expertise: Ikarian diet

Iosif Stenos (Classicist) will talk about the history of the island and the ancient Greek elements that infuse modern Ikaria.

Kyriaki Spanou (theatre director- educator) will speak about the Ikarian concept of time.

Pan-Icarian Brotherhood Chapter Membership Best Practices

Membership is the lifeblood of the Pan-Icarian Brotherhood. Fostering and promoting membership begins first and foremost at the local Chapter level. The Supreme Lodge has developed the following list of suggested "best practices" for Chapters to adopt in order to maintain and increase their membership:

- Make new members feel welcome by sending a welcome letter from the Chapter President and listing benefits of membership.
- Establish a schedule with regular meetings and events which is provided to all members.
- Call members prior to meetings and events and emphasize the importance of having members attend.
- Establish a Chapter Facebook page (and other social media presence, such as Twitter, if
 desired) and use it to communicate with members and increase awareness of the Chapter's
 activities.
- Introduce and expand email communication as a quick way to distribute information and stay connected to members.
- Increase member communication to a minimum of 6 times per year.
- Send 1 to 3 membership renewal notices per year.
- Provide members with the opportunity to pay membership dues at every Chapter meeting and event.
- Provide for and accept credit card/debit payments for membership dues.
- Set deadlines for members to send in their membership dues to the Chapter treasurer.
- Recognize milestone years of membership (e.g., 5, 10, 20, etc. years of continual membership).
- Invite members to become involved in specific projects with a clear end date, to accommodate those interested in participating but with limited available time.
- Consider co-hosting an event with another Chapter in the region.
- Encourage all members to attend the annual Convention and Grand Banquet.
- Develop events of interest to younger generations.
 - This includes hosting events aimed at young adults, as well as events aimed at families with small children.
- Invite younger members to become Chapter officers or join a committee.
- Encourage members ages 18-35 to attend the Brotherhood's annual Youth Conference.
 - Pay for additional youth members to attend the Youth Conference beyond what is currently covered by the Supreme Lodge.
 - Pay for additional expenses (e.g., airfare) for youth members to attend the Youth Conference beyond what is currently covered by the Supreme Lodge.

ΠΑΝΙΚΑΡΙΑΚΗ ΑΔΕΛΦΟΤΗΤΑ ΑΜΕΡΙΚΗΣ «Ο ΙΚΑΡΟΣ» (Ο διαχρονικός Προστάτης και Ευεργέτης της Ικαρίας)

Σε άρθρα μου κατά καιρούς, για διάφορα θέματα της Ικαρίας, έχω αναφερθεί πολλές φορές στη Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής, εξαίροντας σε κάθε ευκαιρία το ενδιαφέρον της και τη βοήθειά της στην ιδιαίτερη πατρίδα μας, της οποίας, για έναν αιώνα περίπου αποτελεί τον διαχρονικό προστάτη και ευεργέτη της, όπως και στον υπότιτλο του άρθρου μου τονίζω.

Σημείωση: «Πριν από την Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής «Ο ΙΚΑΡΟΣ», υπήρχε η Ικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής, που είχε ιδρυθεί στο Πίτσμπουργκ της Πενσυλβάνιας, ανεπίσημα μεν το 1903 και επίσημα το 1905. Οι Καριώτες της Αμερικής και ιδιαίτερα οι παλιές γενιές, έχουν μεγάλη ευαισθησία στις ημερομηνίες αυτές ίδρυσης της Ικαριακής Αδελφότητας Αμερικής, την οποία θεωρούν ως τη μήτρα που γέννησε τη Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής και την τιμούν και την αναφέρουν με μεγάλο σεβασμό, καθώς και τους πρωτοπόρους εκείνους Καριώτες του Πίτσμπουργκ, που τόσο πρώϊμα ίδρυσαν την Αδελφότητά τους.

Λέγεται στους ελληνικούς κύκλους, ότι ήταν το πρώτο Ελληνικό Σωματείο στις ΗΠΑ. Δε μπόρεσα να το επιβεβαιώσω. Το πιστεύω όμως, γιατί οι Καριώτες, όπως επανειλημμένα στη μακραίωνη ιστορία τους έχουν αποδείξει, αγαπούν με ιδιαίτερη ευαισθησία τις ομαδικές πράξεις. Υπάρχουν δε πολλά τέτοια περιστατικά και κατά τη διάρκεια της Τουρκοκρατίας, με κορυφαίο και ολοζώντανο πάντα στις καρδιές των Ικαρίων, μέχρι και σήμερα, το περιστατικό του «Ούλοι εμείς Αφέντη», που συνέβη στα τέλη του 16ου αιώνα μ.Χ., στον Αγιο Κήρυκο, όπου ο Ικαριακός λαός, συγκεκντρωμένος όλος εκεί με διαταγή του Τούρκου Αρχιναύαρχου του Αιγαίου, σύσσωμος, με μια ψυχή και μια φωνή, χωρίς ούτε μια λιποψυχία, αρνήθηκε να υπακούσει στις διαταγές του και τις φοβέρες του για θάνατο και νίκησε! Ισως και να ήταν αυτή η πρώτη πράξη παλλαϊκής αντίστασης κατά των Τούρκων στην κατεχόμενη τότε Ελλάδα.

Ολ' αυτά τα γνώριζαν οι πρώτοι Καριώτες μετανάστες, και ιδιαίτερα οι πιο μεγάλοι, και ήταν πολύ φυσικό στις τρομερές δυσκολίες που αντιμετώπισαν, αγράμματοι οι περισσότεροι, χωρίς γνώση της γλώσσας και απροστάτευτοι στην απληστία και τη βαναυσότητα των εργοδοτών τους, να σκεφθούν να δράσουν από κοινού, ιδρύοντας το σωματείο τους, το σύλλογό τους, ώστε μέσα απ' αυτόν να μπορέσουν, εφαρμόζοντας τη δοκιμασμένη μέθοδο του «όλοι για τον ένα και ο ένας για όλους», να επιβιώσουν και ν'αντιμετωπίσουν τα πολλαπλά και απίστευτα δύσκολα προβλήματά τους.»

Η Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής, «Ο ΙΚΑΡΟΣ», που είναι το θέμα μας, ιδρύθηκε στις 28 Οκτωβρίου 1934 στην πόλη Woungstone του Οχάϊο και από τότε ακμαία, δραστήρια και συνεχώς αυξανόμενη, λειτουργεί και δρα δημιουργικά μέχρι σήμερα.

Πριν προχωρήσω στην αναφορά και αξιολόγηση του τεράστιου μέχρι σήμερα έργου της, θεωρώ αναγκαίο να τονίσω ότι η ίδρυσή της, δεν ήταν ιδιοτροπία των Καριωτών της Αμερικής, αλλά ανάγκη, με την έννοια ότι οι Καριώτες μετανάστες είχαν πολλαπλασιασθεί πολύ γρήγορα και ήταν απλωμένοι σε όλες σχεδόν τις ΗΠΑ και το νέο τους Σωματείο έπρεπε να έχει Παναμερικανική εμβέλεια, να αλλάξει τρόπο οργάνωσης και δομή, να δημιουργήσει παραρτήματα σε όλες σχεδόν τις πόλεις των ΗΠΑ, ώστε να μπορεί να απλώνει τη δραστηριότητά της σ' ολόκληρες τις Ηνωμένες Πολιτείες.

Το σημερινό μου άρθρο, είναι αφιερωμένο εξ ολοκλήρου στην «Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής», ο « ΙΚΑΡΟΣ», και σκοπός μου είναι ν' αναφερθώ στο όλο έργο της, υλικό και ηθικό, που είναι τόσο μεγάλο και τόσο αξιόλογο, ώστε από μόνο του είναι ένας ύμνος, για όσα αμέτρητα έχει κάνει για την Ικαρία και για κατοίκους της προσωπικά.

Πραγματικά, δεν ξέρω τι να πρωτοαναφέρω. Νιώθω δέος μπροστά στο μεγάλο αριθμό και τη σπουδαιότητα των όσων η Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής έχει κάνει για την Ικαρία και τους Καριώτες στις πολλές δεκαετίες της ύπαρξής της. Παρακάτω, αναφέρομαι στα πιο μεγάλα και τα πιο ενδιαφέροντα:

1) Το Γυμνάσιο Αγίου Κηρύκου, αυτό το αρχιτεκτονικό αριστούργημα, που ακόμα και σήμερα εντυπωσιάζει όποιον το αντικρίσει, και στο οποίο, ακριβώς γιατί πρόκειται για αρχιτεκτονικό μνημείο, στεγάζεται σήμερα το σπουδαίο και πλούσιο Αρχαιολογικό Μουσείο Αγίου Κηρύκου, χωρίς ακόμη να έχουν ταξινομηθεί όλα τα αρχαιολογικά ευρήματα

που βρίσκονται στις αποθήκες του. Το κτίριο αυτό ολοκληρώθηκε, ως Γυμνάσιο Ικαρίας και λειτούργησε επί πολλές δεκαετίες, αποτέλεσε το λίκνο των Ικαριακών γραμμάτων και απάλλαξε τους Ικάριους μαθητές από την περιπέτεια – όσοι τουλάχιστον είχαν την οικονομική δυνατότητα – να τρέχουν στη Σάμο, στη Χίο ή στην Αθήνα για να βγάλουν Γυμνάσιο, με τεράστια επιβάρυνση των γονιών, που οι περισσότεροι δεν μπορούσαν να ανταποκριθούν. Ήταν τόση η δίψα των γονιών και των νέων της Ικαρίας για τα γράμματα, ώστε μετά την ίδρυση του Γυμνασίου αυτού, επί πολλά χρόνια κυκλοφορούσε στο νησί, και φαίνεται να ήταν αλήθεια, ότι η Ικαρία, αναλογικά, είχε το υψηλότερο ποσοστό επιστημόνων σε ολόκληρη την Ελλάδα.

- 2) Η σημαντική συμμετοχή της στα πρώτα κεφάλαια για την έναρξη κατασκευής του Λιμανιού του Ευδήλου, ένα έργο που κόστισε πολύ χρήμα και Ικαρίων και του Δημοσίου και παρ'όλο που κοντεύουν 100 χρόνια, ακόμα δεν έχει ολοκληρωθεί εντελώς.
- 3) Τα Δημοτικά σχολεία της Ικαρίας, τα οποία στη συντριπτική τους πλειοψηφία κτίστηκαν εξ ολοκλήρου με χρήματα των Ικαρίων της Αμερικής ή βοήθησαν να κτιστούν, έτσι που όλα τα χωριά της Ικαρίας και τα πιο μικρά να έχουν δικό τους Δημοτικό Σχολείο, ανεξάρτητα αν τα τελευταία χρόνια, με τις αλλαγές που έγιναν στην Παιδεία από τις διάφορες κυβερνήσεις και τα οξύτατα οικονομικά προβλήματα που αντιμετωπίζει η Ελλάδα, τα περισσότερα είναι κλειστά.
- 4) Οι Εκκλησίες της Ικαρίας -εκτός από τις πολύ παλιές- κτίστηκαν επίσης με την γενναία συμβολή των Ικαρίων της Αμερικής.
- 5) Το Νοσοκομείο Ικαρίας, που κτίστηκε και εξοπλίστηκε εξ ολοκλήρου με χρήματα και φροντίδα των Ικαρίων της Αμερικής και σώζει ζωές και γιατρεύονται ασθενείς 60 χρόνια τώρα, ενώ προηγουμένως, για το παραμικρό, έπρεπε οι Καριώτες να ταξιδεύουν στη Σάμο ή στην Αθήνα.
- 6) Το Γηροκομείο Ικαρίας, που 50 και πλέον χρόνια προσφέρει καταφύγιο, φροντίδα και αγάπη σε συμπατριώτες μας ηλικιωμένους, δυστυχισμένους, μόνους και πάμπτωχους, που δεν έχουν στον ήλιο μοίρα, το οποίο Γηροκομείο και σήμερα ακόμη, έστω και σε κατάσταση υπολειτουργίας από υπαιτιότητα του Μητροπολίτη, σε μεγάλο βαθμό συντηρείται με χρήματα της Πανικαριακής Αδελφότητας Αμερικής.
- 7) Πολλές μέχρι σήμερα υποτροφίες σπουδών σε ικανούς και διακριθέντες, φτωχούς μαθητές της Ικαρίας.
- 8) Πολλοί κάτοικοι της Ικαρίας ή της Ικαριακής παροικίας Αθηνών, με βαρύτατες ασθένειες, έχουν ταξιδέψει κατά καιρούς στην Αμερική για λόγους υγείας και για αρρώστιες για τις οποίες δεν μπορούσαν να θεραπευτούν εδώ, με δαπάνη της «Πανικαριακής Αδελφότητας Αμερικής».
- 9) Η ίδρυση πριν 40 χρόνια περίπου, του Foundation, ιδρύματος που αποτελεί το καμάρι της «Πανικαριακής Αδελφότητας», με σοβαρά κεφάλαια σήμερα από συνδρομές και δωρεές των μελών της, σκοπός του οποίου είναι η συνδρομή και η βοήθεια σε κάθε Καριώτη που έχει ιατρική ανάγκη και αδυνατεί να την αντιμετωπίσει και η συμμετοχή του σε θέματα που αφορούν την ιδιαίτερη πατρίδα μας, την Ικαρία, ή Καριώτες που αντιμετωπίζουν προβλήματα σοβαρά και η επίλυσή τους απαιτεί οικονομικό κόστος που δεν μπορούν να καλύψουν με άλλο τρόπο.
- 10) Η ίδρυση, με παρότρυνση και έμπνευσή της, πριν 35 χρόνια, του Κουτσούλιου Ιδρύματος στον Εύδηλο, από τον Ευεργέτη Εμμαν. Κατσούλη, που εξυπηρέτησε και εξακολουθεί να εξυπηρετεί πολλαπλά τον Εύδηλο μέχρι σήμερα.
- 11) Δωρεές, μέσω του Foundation της Πανικαριακής ενός εκατομμυρίου δολαρίων περίπου προς το Γηροκομείο Ικαρίας, από τον εξαίρετο συμπατριώτη μας Γ. Σουρουμάνη, ο οποίος πρέπει να ανακηρυχτεί ευεργέτης του Γηροκομείου

Αυτά και ίσως και άλλα που δεν γνωρίζω, είναι τα μεγάλα έργα που από την Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής, ή μέλη της, με την δική της όμως πάντοτε έμπνευση και προτροπή, έχουν πραγματοποιηθεί στην Ικαρία, διαχρονικά, όποιο και αν ήταν κάθε φορά το Διοικητικό της Συμβούλιο.

Κλείνοντας το άρθρο μου, θέλω να εκφράσω προσωπικά, αλλά και εκ μέρους όλων των Ικαρίων πιστεύω, ιδιαίτερα των πιο μεγάλων ηλικιών, ένα απέραντο ευχαριστώ και την πιο βαθιά ευγνωμοσύνη, για όσα η Πανικαριακή Αδελφότητα Αμερικής έχει προσφέρει στην ιδιαίτερη Πατρίδα μας και σε Καριώτες προσωπικά μέχρι σήμερα, και ας είναι τα λόγια μου αυτά ένα μικρό μπουκέτο αγριολούλουδα της Ικαριακής γης, στο τάφο και ένα φτωχό μνημόσυνο για όσους, μέλη των Διοικητικών Συμβουλίων της ή απλά μέλη της, έχουν πεθάνει και τους διαβεβαιώ ότι η ευγνωμοσύνη των Ικαρίων της ιδιαίτερης πατρίδας μας θα τους συνοδεύει παντοτεινά. Αιωνία τους η μνήμη.

"Ούλοι εμείς Αφέντη" του Γιάννη Μουλά

Τέλη του 16ου αιώνα μ.Χ. Οι στιβαροί νέοι που έχουν οριστεί να περιφέρουν στους ώμους τους, στα διάφορα χωριά της Ικαρίας, μέσα από κακοτράχαλα βουνά και δύσβατους κατσικόδρομους, το φορείο με τον Τούρκο Διοικητή, όπως το είχε επιβάλει ο βάρβαρος, έχουν πάρει πια την απόφασή τους. Ο τύραννος πρέπει να πεθάνει! Συμφώνησαν να τον πετάξουν στο Κακό Καταβασίδι, το τρομερό βάραθρο της Φάρδης. Ορισαν και το σύνθημα, «συγκούνουδο τ' αρνί» και ποιος απ'όλους θα το πεί την ώρα που πρέπει. Ξεκίνησαν από τον Αγιο Κήρυκο προς τη Φάρδη και μόλις έφτασαν στο χείλος του βάραθρου, μια βροντερή φωνή «συγκούνουδο τ' αρνί» έσκισε τον αέρα. Κι αμέσως το φορείο με το Διοικητή βρέθηκε στο κενό, στο χάος, εκεί που δεν υπήρχε γυρισμός. Η είδηση εξόντωσης του Διοικητή, έφτασε κάποτε στην Κωνσταντινούπολη. Το Διβάνι διατάσσει αμέσως τον Αρχιναύαρχο του Αιγαίου να πλεύσει στην Ικαρία, να ερευνήσει και να μάθει ποιοι σκότωσαν το Διοικητή και να τους τιμωρήσει με θάνατο.

Ο Αρχιναύαρχος, όσο πιο γρήγορα μπορούσε, έφτασε στην Ικαρία κι έβγαλε επείγουσα διαταγή, όλοι οι κάτοικοι του νησιού να συγκεντρωθούν στον Αγιο Κήρυκο. Την επόμενη κιόλας, ήταν όλοι εκεί, κι ο Αρχιναύαρχος από ψηλά, με τραχιά φωνή, κατακόκκινος από θυμό για το θράσος των γκιαούρηδων, ρωτά το συγκεντρωμένο πλήθος, απειλώντας τους με θάνατο, να του πούν ποιος σκότωσε το Διοικητή. Ακρα σιωπή. Ανησυχία ζωγραφισμένη στα πρόσωπα των συγκεντρωμένων. Τα βλέμματά τους διασταυρώνονται, προσπαθώντας να συννενοηθούν σιωπηρά. Και ξαφνικά, μια μυριόστομη φωνή, ήρεμη, χωρίς πρόκληση, αλλ' αποφαστστική, ακούγεται απ' όλο αυτό το ανθρωπομάνι, «Ούλοι εμείς Αφέντη». Ούτε μια λιποψυχία, ούτε μια αντίθετη φωνή. Η ομοψυχία και η αποφασιστικότητα στην αποθέωσή τους.

Στο άκουσμα αυτής της φράσης, τα μάτια του Αρχιιναύαρχου έβγαλαν αστραπές, ο θυμός του έγινε οργή ασυγκράτητη, και με μια φωνή που έμοιαζε μ' αστροπελέκι, ρώτησε ξανά: «Για τελευταία φορά σας ρωτώ: Ποιός σκότωσε το Διοικητή? » και ταυτόχρονα, με παραμορφωμένο από την οργή πρόσωπο, έδωκε αυστηρή εντολή τα πυροβόλα της Ναυαρχίδας να γυρίσουν τις μπούκες τους κατά του μαζεμένου λαού. Ο λαός των ρακένδυτων, γυμνών σχεδόν, ξυπόλυτων και άοπλων προγόνων μας, άκουσε τις απειλές του Αρχιναύαρχου, είδε τα κανόνια στραμμένα πάνω του, αναδεύτηκε σαν ένα γιγαντιαίο κύμα που φούσκωσε, ζύγιασε την απόφασή του και σε λίγο σαν ένας γίγαντας κινήθηκε ήρεμος και αποφασισμένος να παλέψει με το θεριό και να νικήσει! Με μια φωνή που λες και βγήκε από το στήθος ενός μυθικού ήρωα, δυνατή σαν κανονιά, αλλά ήρεμη σα θεϊκή, απάντησε και πάλι, «Ούλοι εμείς Αφέντη». Με μια απαλάδα και μια ηρεμία μοναδική, κατάκτηση του ανθρώπου που δε φοβάται πια, του πλήθους που νίκησε το φόβο, και αυτή η αντρειοσύνη του ούτε τρομάζει ούτε φοβερίζεται. Και τότε έγινε μια ησυχία και χύθηκε μια τέτοια ηρεμία στα πρόσωπα και τις καρδιές του συναγμένου πλήθους, που σαν έτοιμο από καιρό, περίμενε τα πάντα, αλλά δε φοβόταν πια τίποτα! Και ξαφνικά έγινε το θαύμα. Το πρόσωπο του Αρχιναύαρχου άλλαξε όψη, ηρέμησε και αντί τα κανόνια της Ναυαρχίδας του να σπείρουν τον όλεθρο, το θάνατο και την καταστροφή, ο Αρχιναύαρχος ήρεμος σαν από θεϊκό άγγιγμα, κεραυνοβολημένος, συνεπαρμένος από το μεγαλείο του ασήμαντου αλλά γενναίου λαού, έβγαλε φωνή στεντόρια, όμως ήρεμη, προς το πλήρωμα της Ναυαρχίδας του, αξιωματικούς και ναύτες: «Στο πλοίο όλοι και ετοιμαστείτε αμέσως για απόπλου». Εριξε μια τελευταία ματιά σ'αυτό το λαό, τον ελάχιστο -τον μέγα, μπήκε στη Ναυαρχίδα και ξεκίνησε για τα νέα ταξίδια του.

Κι η Ικαρία της ιστορίας, η Ικαρία του θρύλου, η Ικαρία των μύθων και των παραμυθιών, αναθυμάται με περηφάνια μέχρι σήμερα αυτή τη συναρπαστική ιστορία, που φαίνεται να ΄ναι αληθινή πέρα για πέρα, και όχι γέννημα φαντασίας κάποιας καλομάνας, που έπλαθε, πασπαλίζοντάς τα με πολύ ηρωισμό και πολλήν αντρειοσύνη, παραμύθια του νησιού, με τα οποία μεγαλώσαμε όλες, οι μέχρι το τέλος του μεγάλου πολέμου, Ικαριακές γενιές.

Icarians gathered funds to give Ioannis Lefes a proper funeral and burial.


This was the first unified act of compassion by the Icarians, helping a fellow Icarian brother, and was the impetus to form a society to promote the welfare of all Icarians.

Steve D. Stephanadis

Steve D. Stephanadis, age 87, passed away peacefully on March 8, 2017 at the University of Maryland Charles Regional Medical Center, having been a resident of Charles Country, Maryland for the past 48 years.

Steve was born in 1930 in Cleveland, Ohio, eldest of three children of two Greek immigrants from the beautiful island of Ikaria, Greece in the Aegean Sea. The family moved to Wilmington, NC when Steve was 2 years old where he subsequently graduated from New Hanover High School and Wilmington College (later UNCW). Steve enlisted in the US Air Force in April 1953 and was part of the 48th Fighter Interceptor Squadron based at Langley AFB, Hampton, Virginia. After his active duty service, he continued to serve in the USAF Reserve through March 1961. During this time Steve also met and married Golfo Panayiota Kakavas of Washington, DC (the daughter of Greek immigrants as well from Piraeus, Greece). Steve and Golfo had two children, Demetrios (aka Jim) and Hope. After his honorable discharge from the Air Force, Steve joined the Department of Justice, Immigration and Naturalization Service, progressing to Assistant District Director of Investigations before retiring in June 1985. Steve left behind many friends and colleagues at the Service upon retiring.

Steve was preceded in death by his parents Demetrios and Argero (nee Konzaman) Stefanadis; wife Golfo (nee Kakavas); brother Gus D. Stefanadis (Sonja nee Binikos); sister Helen (Jim Tsigounis); and daughter Hope.

John Glaros

John Glaros began his island adventures on November 8, 1914 in in the village of Glaredo, Ikaria, Greece. He completed his earthly journey on May 12, 2017 in Holiday, Florida. John was the loving son of George and Argyro Glaros, and cherished brother of Dimitri, Maria, Louie, Manoli, Zacharias, and Joanna. As a youth John was free-spirited and continued to exhibit a strong, independent force throughout his productive life. He embraced nature with a passion and was often soothed by the gifts of water. The ocean was a constant in John's life, and remained a life

long mentor of important lessons in his philosophical outreach. As John matured, he channeled his amazing strength into many physical activities. As a youth, John enjoyed all sports, with a special passion for track and field events. John's incredible physical energy was evident as he competed in decathlons. His dedication as a champion was showcased due to endless hours of practice in shot put, long jump, running, etc. He excelled in so many sports; however, as child of the island, long distance swimming brought him his greatest pleasure. John advocated for himself and others a healthier lifestyle. In the years that followed, family thoroughly enjoyed his singing, story telling, and amusing mischievous jokes, with friends and fellow islanders. Merriment was part of his playful personality; as life began to unfold in tragic ways. John was instrumental in the survival of the Glaros family as he shouldered great responsibility in attending to



tasks necessary to farming on rocky soil and difficult mountain terrain. No matter the weather conditions, John toiled to support the family in its farming endeavors. Goat herding meant walking miles to locate shrub suitable for the animals, in addition to collecting shrubs for fire in the family hearth. John performed many types of work to ensure the family's well being; his initiation into hard work was a source of familial pride.

In the early 1930's, John began to develop a deep desire to come to America, the land of opportunity. John joined the Greek Merchant Marines and learned invaluable survival skills. After his father passed, it became clear that John could better serve his family by traveling to America. As an immigrant, he struggled to enter the country twice by actually jumping off the ship as it neared the Statue of Liberty! He was handcuffed and deported both times after being caught in New York City by immigration officials. His determination never wavered; on the third attempt he achieved success.

In World War II, John volunteered to serve his country by fighting in the Army. His allegiance to America was formidable and he was proud to aid America in any way that he could. Upon returning home from fighting, he married Martha. Employment was not available, so the couple ventured out to California. Several years passed, and Martha yearned to return to her family in Ohio. In time, he became a butcher, which led John operating and owning his own business until he retired. A few years later, the couple decided to move to Florida to enjoy a fuller and more active life style. The Glaros family was involved in the Greek community and the Pan-Icarian Brotherhood of America. Frequent trips to Greece and California were the highlights of their travel adventures. John especially relished making wine and deep sea ocean fishing with his sister, Joanna, and brother in law, Stellios Petsakos in California. John took great delight in walking along beaches, gardening, and cooking nutritious and delicious Ikarian meals.

On personal matters, John endured many disappointments; however, he carried on with a strong, determined heart. He fought with great conviction and was adamant about surviving stomach cancer, both times, even though doctors warned him about the possibility of dying. The tragic loss of both his beautiful daughters, Argie and Sophia, in addition to his loving wife, Martha, was a heavy burden on his heart. John was first and foremost, a survivor of great magnitude. He bore difficult conditions and strengthened his resolve to overcome challenges. His incredible character would not permit otherwise! John counseled his family with his quiet actions by sharing his wonderful emotional strength and dignity. May God bless this traveler, our sweet Uncle John with everlasting peace.
