
Dear Ikarian Family and Friends,

κουβέντα μας για το οδοιπορικό του, δεν μπορούσα ποτέ να φανταστώ, ότι θα με συνέπαιρνε τόσο πολύ η ιστορία ενός ακόμα Ελληνα μετανάστη, που οι δυσκολίες και οι κακουχίες που πέρασε θα τον δυνάμωναν τόσο, ώστε, όχι μόνο να δημιουργήσει μια σημαντική περιουσία και μια ανεκτίμητη οικογένεια, αλλά και να βοηθήσει το νησί του, που ποτέ δεν ξέχασε, την ενορία του Greek Orthodox Church of the Assumption, και κυρίως τη «μικρή Ελλάδα της Αμερικής», που την έβαλε μέσα στο πανεπιστήμιο του Stony Brook, χρηματοδοτώντας και ιδρύοντας την πρώτη έδρα Ελληνικής Γλώσσας και το πρώτο Κέντρο Ελληνικού Πολιτισμού στο πανεπιστήμιο του Λονγκ Αϊλαντ. Η ζωή και οι προσπάθειες του Πέτρου Τσαντέ, είναι ένα πολύτιμο δείγμα, αλλά και υπόδειγμα, του τι μπορεί να κάνει ο άνθρωπος, όταν το πεπρωμένο τον προκαλεί να έρθει αντιμέτωπος με τον μόχθο και τη στέρηση. Ας ρωτήσουμε τον ίδιο... έχει πολλά να μας πει...

Κύριε Τσαντέ, τι σας παρακίνησε να ιδρύσετε την Εδρα Ελληνικών Σπουδών στο Stony Brook και να κάνετε επίσης δωρεά στο κολλέγιο Richard Stockton στο Νιου Τζέρσεϊ, για την εκμάθηση της ελληνικής γλώσσας; Και εγώ και η οικογένειά μου έχουμε μέσα μας πάντα την Ελλάδα, τη γλώσσα, ιστορία, τον πολιτισμό, την προσφορά της σε όλο τον κόσμο. Τη χώρα αυτή που εμπλούτισε την υφήλιο με τους θεούς και τους ήρωές της, τους φιλόσοφους και τους επιστήμονες. Σκέφτηκα λοιπόν, πως κάτι πρέπει να αφήσουμε κι εμείς, όπως άφησαν οι πρόγονοί μας. Ηρθα αμέσως σε επαφή με το πανεπιστήμιο του Stony Brook στο Λονγκ Αϊλαντ, συγκεκριμένα με την κυρία Στέλλα Συρτά, η οποία δούλευε τότε εκεί, και την ρώτησα, αν έχουν ελληνική έδρα. Μου απάντησε πως δεν είχαν. Τότε της είπα, πως εγώ και η οικογένειά μου θα θέλαμε να ιδρύσουμε μία τέτοια ελληνική έδρα. Εκανε όλες απαραίτητες

προετοιμασίες με τους καθηγητές και ξεχώρισαν μία αίθουσα, όπου δημιουργήθηκε η ελληνική έδρα. Παράλληλα δημιουργήθηκε και ένα Κέντρο Ελληνικού Πολιτισμού, στο οποίο συγκεντρώνονται οι καθηγητές και δίνουν διαλέξεις στα θέματα που αφορούν την Ελλάδα, τη γλώσσα μας και την ιστορία του Ελληνισμού. Το κολλέγιο Richard Stockton στο Νιου Τζέρσεϊ, ήταν η πρώτη μου προσπάθεια να βάλω τη διδασκαλία της ελληνικής γλώσσας σε αμερικανικό πανεπιστήμιο και χρηματοδότησα τη συγκεκριμένη εκμάθηση, χωρίς να δημιουργηθεί έδρα.

Θα μας εξηγήσετε τον λόγο; Εγώ γεννήθηκα στο Καραβόσταμο της Ικαρίας και έχασα τους γονείς μου πολύ μικρός. Η μητέρα μου πέθανε

από την πείνα του Β' Παγκοσμίου Πολέμου στα 30 της χρόνια. Ο πατέρας μου δούλευε στην Εύβοια νητο,

σκορπιστήκαμε σε συγγενείς και οικογένειες που μας πήραν σαν παραγιούς και δουλεύαμε στον κάμπο. Είχαμε και μια αδελφούλα, την Φιλιώ, που πέθανε τριών χρονών από την πείνα. Εμένα στα 10 μου χρόνια με πήρε μια οικογένεια σαν παραγιό και δούλευα στα κτήματα. Το δεύτερο χρόνο που ήμουν μαζί τους, με είδε μια μέρα στο δρόμο ρακένδυτο και ταλαιπωρημένο παιδί, όπως ήμουν, η Αικατερίνη Σπανού Βατούγιου, σύζυγος του Χαράλαμπου Βατούγιου, η οποία με λυπήθηκε και μου είπε «έλα μαζί μου, θα σε έχω σαν παιδί μου». Ετσι από το πουθενά, λυπημένος και ορφανός, βρέθηκα να έχω μια ζεστή οικογένεια και μια μητέρα. Ο σύζυγός της ήταν στην Αμερική και δούλευε. Ετσι με έβαλαν μες την οικογένεια, με ένυσαν, με τάισαν γιατί ήμουν πολύ αδύνατος και απόκτησα 5 αδέλφια, τον Δημήτρη, την Αγγελική, τον Νίκο, την Δέσποινα και την Αννα.στα κάρβουνα και με τον πόλεμο χάσαμε τα ίχνη του. Μάθαμε ότι κρυβόταν και μετά πέθανε. Εγώ με τα αδέλφια μου, τον Αντρέα πρωτογέννητο και τον Φώτη τριτογέν-Πρέπει να ήμουν 12 χρονών τότε. Σ' αυτήν την γυναίκα που με υιοθέτησε, αφιέρωσα την έδρα, γιατί αυτή

μου έσωσε την ζωή.

Στην Αμερική πώς βρεθήκατε;

Το 1946 ο Χαράλαμπος Βατούγιος κάλεσε την οικογένεια στην Αμερική, αλλά εγώ έπρεπε να μείνω στην Ικαρία και να πάω το Γυμνάσιο στον Αγιο Κήρυκο. Η θετή μου μητέρα έφυγε με τα παιδιά της για την Αμερική και εγώ νοίκιασα ένα δωμάτιο με άλλα παιδιά δίπλα στο σχολείο. Μου είχε αφήσει χρήματα, για να καλύπτω όλα μου τα έξοδα και μου έστελνε και από την Αμερική, όταν δεν είχα. Εκείνη την εποχή τα γυμνάσια ήταν εξαιρετικά στην Ελλάδα και οι δάσκαλοι ήταν πάρα πολύ ευσυνείδητοι. Μας δίδασκαν όλη την Παγκόσμια Ιστορία, την Οδύσσεια και την Ιλιάδα. Μόλις αποφοίτησα το 1951 μου έκαναν πρόσκληση και ήρθα στο Wilmington (Γουίλμινγκτον) στη Βόρεια Καρολίνα. Με έκριναν κατάλληλο να αρχίσω να μαθαίνω αγγλικά από την προτελευταία τάξη του Γυμνασίου, γιατί όπως είπαν στην μητέρα μου «αυτός ξέρει περισσότερα απ' αυτούς που αποφοιτούν από τα κολέγια μας». Τελείωσα το γυμνάσιο με άριστα, αλλά δεν είχαμε κολλέγιο να συνεχίσω τις σπουδές μου. Είχα έναν εξάδελφο στην Πενσυλβάνια, ο οποίος μου πρότεινε να πάμε μαζί να γραφτούμε σε μία Αεροπορική Ακαδημία. Εγώ καταγόμενος από την ιχθυόεσσα Ικαρία, από τη θάλασσα που έπεσε ο πρώτος πιλότος της ιστορίας, ο Ικαρος, αποφάσισα να πάω στην Ακαδημία και εκεί έγινα Μηχανικός Αεροσκαφών. Εμεινα δύο χρόνια εκεί στη σχολή και μετά έπιασα δουλειά στην ΤWA στην Πενσυλβάνια. Επειδή όμως εργαζόμουν μόνο τη νύχτα και δεν έκανα καλά χρήματα, παρουσιάστηκε μία ευκαιρία με την North East Airlines στη Νέα Υόρκη, που ζητούσε μηχανικούς και πήγα.

Ψάχνατε πάντα το καλύτερο! Πότε φτάσατε στη ΝΥ;

Γύρω στο 1953 με κάλεσαν στη Νέα Υόρκη στο La Guardia. Δούλευα σκληρά και έκανα πολύ καλή δουλειά, γεγονός που με αναβάθμισε σε επιθεωρητή των μηχανικών και σύντομα προβιβάστηκα σε πρώτο επιθεωρητή. Εμπαινα μέσα στο αεροπλάνο, ξεκινούσα τις μηχανές, να ελέγξω αν οι μηχανικοί έκαναν καλή δουλειά, υπέγραφα και έπρεπε να πάρω το αεροπλάνο από το υπόστεγο και να το πάω στο σημείο της εκκίνησής του, στην πύλη δηλαδή, που θα το έπαιρνε ο πιλότος. Εκεί έμεινα τέσσερα χρόνια και μετά παρουσιάστηκε μία άλλη ευκαιρία. Ενας γνωστός μου στο Τζάκσον Χάιτς, ο όποιος προμήθευε με λαχανικά τα εστιατόρια, μου λέει μια μέρα «πόσα

χρήματα κάνεις;». Του είπα «180 την εβδομάδα» και μου απαντά «θέλεις να κάνεις 350 και πάνω και να μάθεις πώς να αγοράζεις και να πουλάς λαχανικά;». Δούλεψα μαζί του δύο εβδομάδες, έμαθα τη δουλειά και μου πούλησε την επιχείρησή του μετά από λίγο καιρό. Αγόρασα το φορτηγάκι με 3.000 δολάρια τότε και ξεκίνησα την πρώτη μου επιχείρηση, η οποία κράτησε από το 1960 έως το 1966.

Και μετά με τι ασχοληθήκατε;

Είχα μαζέψει χρήματα και έβλεπα, όταν πήγαινα στα εστιατόρια, πως από ένα κεφάλι μαρούλια κάνεις τόσες σαλάτες και τόσο κέρδος και έτσι αποφάσισα και εγώ να κάνω τη δεύτερη δική μου επιχείρηση. Αγόρασα μία Dinner στο Λονγκ Αϊ- λαντ, που ονόμασα «Blue Dove Dinner», γιατί όταν δούλευα στο εμπόριο λαχανικών ξύπναγα πολύ πρωί και έβλεπα την αυγή με τα μοναδικά της γαλάζια και μπλε χρώματα, κάτι που με εντυπωσίαζε πολύ. Την ξεκίνησα το 1970 με χωρητικότητα 90 καθίσματα, το 1978 η χωρητικότητα πήγε στα 175 και το 1986 έφτασε τα 250 καθίσματα.

Την κράτησα μέχρι το 2000. Είχα ήδη κάνει μια σεβαστή περιουσία, είχα αγοράσει κτήματα, ένα μεγάλο κτίριο, οπότε δε χρειάστηκε μετά να δουλέψω.

Τα αδέλφια σας τι απέγιναν; Οπως σας είπα τα αδέλφια μου ήταν και αυτοί παραγιοί σε συγγενείς και οικογένειες. Οταν ήρθα και μετά από λίγα χρόνια έγινα Αμερικανός πολίτης έφερα τα δυο αδέλφια μου εδώ και βρήκαν κάποια δουλειά, μάζεψαν χρήματα και γύρισαν πίσω στην Ελλάδα, γιατί δεν τους άρεσε η Αμερική. Στην Ελλάδα παντρεύτηκαν και επέστρεψαν στην Αμερική με τις γυναίκες τους. Τότε είχα την Dinner και ο Φώτης δούλευε μαζί μου, ενώ ο Ανδρέας έβαφε σπίτια. Ο Φώτης άνοιξε δική του Dinner και ο Αντρέας παρέμεινε στη δουλειά που είχε. Δυστυχώς πέθανε εδώ και πέντε χρόνια από μια ασθένεια των πνευμόνων, που οφείλεται στις εισπνοές της μπογιάς. Με τα άλλα μου θετά αδέλφια, τον Νίκο, την Δέσποινα, τον Ερρίκο, την Αννα συναντιόμαστε, δυστυχώς όχι τώρα με τον κορωνοϊό.

Στο Woodside (Γούντσάιντ) που έμενα, εκεί κοντά μας είχαμε το Τμήμα της Πανικαριακής Αδελφότητας που λεγότανε «Πανδίκη». Εκεί κάναμε συνεδριάσεις, εκδηλώσεις, χορούς, τραγούδια και ξενύχτια και βρισκόμασταν όλοι οι Ικαριώτες φίλοι και γνωστοί. Μια βραδιά σε μια εκδήλωση τα κορίτσια χόρευαν Ικαριώτικο και «εκείνη» βαστούσε τον κύκλο. Εγώ με κάποιο φίλο καθόμασταν στην άκρη και τις κοιτούσαμε. Εκεί που ο κύκλος γύριζε γύρω γύρω, για κάποιο λόγο μια όμορφη κοπέλα μου έριχνε κρυφές ματιές. Αυτό ήταν η αιτία που αρχίσαμε να συναντιόμαστε, γνωριστήκαμε περισσότερο και παντρευτήκαμε το 1961, όταν ήμουν 31 ετών εγώ και 37 η γυναίκα μου, αλλά φαινόταν πάντα νέα. Μείναμε 60 χρόνια μαζί. Εφυγε τον περασμένο Σεπτέμβρη. Μαζί αποκτήσαμε δυο παιδιά, την Σοφία και τον Βασίλη και 4 εγγόνια, τρεις εγγονές από τον Βασίλη και μια εγγονή από την Σοφία. Αγόρια δεν κάνανε.

«Φωνή βοώντος εν τη ερήμω»! Εγω τα λέω εγώ τα ακούω.

Εάν εμείς εδώ, σαν δεύτερη μεγάλη γενιά, δεν ιδρύσουμε Ελληνικό Πανεπιστήμιο, που να φοιτούν εκεί οι επόμενες ελληνικές γενιές για όλες τις επιστήμες, τις τέχνες, τον ελληνικό πολιτισμό και τη γλώσσα μας, ώστε να συνεχιστεί η παρουσία του Ελληνισμού στην Αμερική, θα ξεχαστούμε και θα πέσουμε στην αφάνεια! Αυτό

το περίσσευμα του μυαλού και της οικονομικής ακμής των μορφωμένων Ελλήνων της Αμερικής, κάπου πρέπει να στεγαστεί, να προστατευτεί, με μια συνεχή παρουσία μέσα στην πανεθνία της Αμερικής. Αυτή τη γλώσσα μας την θεομίλητη, την γλώσσα της ψαλμωδίας, της μελωδίας, του χορού, της ποίησης, του δράματος, της φιλοσοφίας και της επιστήμης! This Oakmont native is coaching — and growing — football in Italy Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, June 3, 2021

When Dimitri Facaros learned he was going to be stationed in San Remo, Italy, a friend recommended he check out John Grisham's 2007 novel "Playing for Pizza," the fictional story of an NFL washout who keeps his football dream alive by joining up with an Italian club. The Oakmont native, who serves as a major in the U.S. Army's Judge Advocate General Corp., read it and loved it, and it was on his mind one afternoon as he and his young family were touring their temporary hometown on the country's northwestern coast.

The unit of four stepped into a clothing store, where pictures of American football players adorning the walls caught Maj. Facaros' eye. The man in one of the pictures was working behind the counter, so Maj. Facaros asked him about them. It turned out he was a coach with the Savona Pirates, a second-division team based about an hour away. Maj. Facaros went home, did some research and promptly reached out to management. And it wasn't long before he was living out Mr. Grisham's literary plot in real life as he was offered and accepted a role as the Pirates' special teams and quality control assistant. "I feel like I'm almost back in college," Maj. Facaros told the Post-Gazette in a recent interview. "It takes me back to a different time. I'm in a locker room as if I'm back to 18 or 19. ... It's been a cool experience."

Maj. Facaros, like many from Western Pennsylvania, developed his love of the game at an early age, growing up as

the son of a high school principal at Schenley and Peabody high schools and an industrial painter whose projects included Heinz Field and the Fort Duquesne Bridge.

He went on to serve as captain of the team at Riverview High School before college stops at St. John's and SUNY-Buffalo. Now he hopes his experience can help players who did not grow up in the game the same way he did.

The Pirates play in 2° Division, an amateur traveling division. Only Italians are eligible; Americans can play only in the top division, Serie A. And for most, the organization provides their first experience with American football. The club itself, however, is not a new phenomenon. Savona has played in one of the country's three divisions since 1984, winning championships at the second and third division levels along the way.



Today, Italy has a total of 56 clubs, most of which are located in the northern and central portions of the country. Savona competes regionally and faces teams from farther away. in Italy or elsewhere in Europe, if it advances in the championships.

The organization fields senior male and female teams, as well as junior and senior flag football teams for younger players. Currently, about 150 players are members. And so far, they've been happy to learn from Maj. Facaros. "Besides his technical abilities, he has the ability to convey, with enthusiasm, the spirit of American football. The aptitude for training and sacrifice," vice president Eugenio Meini said in an email.

That's appreciated in a country where no one's really playing for money and soccer captures the bulk of public attention. The culture of the sport can understandably get lost in translation, so players, including quarterback Federico Burato, are happy to soak it up where they can.

Mr. Burato, 25, grew up in San Remo and now lives in Genoa, a bit down the road from Savona. Like many Europeans, he first became aware of American football through movies such as "Remember the Titans" and "Any Given Sunday." Then one day, he discovered his friend's father had a football, and the rest was history. "I threw one time, and it was pure love," he said. He joined the Pirates soon after and has been with them ever since, eventually earning the starting job with a dual-threat skill set that's compatible with the run-first style many Europeans clubs use. He said

the mentality Maj. Facaros has helped to instill is rare and that the coach has pushed players hard, even though they typically only practice twice a week. "Having someone like him around helps us to understand what football is really like," he said.

At the same time, Maj. Facaros doesn't want to sell their own passion short. He said he loves the concentration in the locker room, describing it as something out of a "movie scene." And he's been impressed by how invested players are on a purely recreational level, with none of the financial interests that many in America have.

He's also enjoyed teaching the finer points of kicking between his career in the Army and tending to his family, including his 3-month-old, at home. Unfortunately, he'll have to give the job up eventually. He'll spend part of the summer in Italy before returning to the U.S. for his next posting at Fort Bragg in North Carolina.

For now, though, he's enjoying the unique opportunity to grow the game he loves with people who are eager to learn. "When I went to this field, I was just in awe because you could just see what brings together a bunch of folks," he said, describing his first game with the Pirates. "To see American football in Italy, to me, was just a little abnormal in a way that made it feel special."

As for Mr. Burato, he hopes more Americans follow in Maj. Facaros' footsteps in helping get the game established in Europe generally and Italy in particular. It remains hard to watch NFL games in the country, and he feels there's an appetite for more organization that can capture the imagination of more players and fans. "All we need is just a little bit of help to help the game grow," he said. "We are not so professional about it, and that's something I hope one day can change."

people currently flying a helicopter on Mars). This would be an unmitigated achievement in awesomeness under any circumstances, but I'm particularly proud knowing everything she had to go through to get here.

To say Dina overcomes obstacles is an understatement. When we first moved back to the states, she was in middle school and still developing strategies to manage her rather severe dyslexia. The district unsupportive to say the least, with limited educational assistance and a lot of excessive, stress inducing red tape. At one point, they even conveniently lost paperwork for her legally mandated individual learning plan. She was actively discouraged from pursuing STEM-one teacher telling her she'd never even graduate high school, and instead pushed into art and architecture (something at which she's very talented, but it's not her calling).

After one year of architecture school she dropped out and enrolled in the local community college to study Physics. Now, congrats to our new board member team! We are looking forward to our youth led Ikarian Independence Day event and all future plans!













My dear sister Dorothy Martinos was born November 21, 1930, and passed away at her home in Long Island, NY, March 24, 2021. She was buried next to her beloved husband George Martinos at our family cemetery in Cleveland, Ohio. Dorothy was born in Akron, where our parents lived for a very short time. Her youthful years were spent in Cleveland, and the last many years of her life she and George lived in New York and spent winters in Clearwater Beach, FL.

Throughout her life, Dorothy personified the two attributes instilled in our family by our parents: Resilience and Independence. Dorothy suffered many physical problems and shocks in her life and dealt with them with great resilience. Dorothy was born with hip dysplasia at a time when medical science was doing much research to correct this problem. Our parents agreed to several experimental surgeries, none of which were successful. But Dorothy never thought of herself as handicapped in any way. As a young girl she learned to dance, even the Kariotiko, she ice-skated, and became a good swimmer. During the last several years of her life she was confined to a wheelchair. In spite of all her physical problems, she did all she could to enjoy life and to remain independent in her own homes in New York and Florida.

In high school, in addition to all college academic classes, she also learned secretarial skills which helped her find work as a secretary to pay her way through college, along with what little help our parents could give her. She received her Bachelor of Science degree from Fenn College and her Master of Science degree from Case Western University.





Dorothy was a teacher when she met and married George Martinos, a recent immigrant from the Greek island Kythnos. After a short time, George enlisted in the army and was sent to Germany for two years during the Korean War. Dorothy accompanied him to Germany and spent those two years teaching English to German children.

George was adept in many technical skills. He was also a brilliant businessman. With Dorothy at his side, they achieved great financial success. They took many trips to Ikaria as well as to his island of Kythnos to see his parents, whom he supported.

In 2007, after George passed away, Dorothy successfully took charge of all George's financial responsibilities. Also, Dorothy and I took

countless flights from New York to Florida and Cleveland to spend the holidays with my son George Gary Thomas, his wife Crystal, and the family.

In Florida, during the most raging Covid month, when every was warned of the danger of taking airline trips, in spite of all our effort to dissuade her, she was adamant about flying back to New York. She wanted the family to respect her independence and to respect her wishes.

George and Dorothy were very dedicated to the Long Island Church of the Assumption where Dorothy's 40-day memorial was held.

Dorothy was also very proud of her Icarian heritage. She was a member of Helios Chapter in Clearwater. She was also a co-sponsor of a Pan-Icarian Foundation Scholarship in memory of our parents, George and Elizabeth Pastis.
