

In the 1960s, many of the philanthropic endeavors were directed toward the Pan-Icarian Foundation that was headquartered in Pittsburgh. In the early stages of the Foundation's establishment, there was an air of uncertainty about the vision of this entity because many members did not understand how it would operate. Luckily, the few who initially understood the Foundation's foresight, such as PSPs Christ E. Aivaliotis and George L. Vassilaros of Pittsburgh, worked tirelessly to influence the local and national membership to accept this proposal.

In September of 1965, The Pan-Icarian Foundation officially became the philanthropic mechanism of the Pan-Icarian Brotherhood. The Pan-Icarian Foundation was established with a deed of trust, on September 6, 1965, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The Foundation charter states that the Pan Icarian Brotherhood will distribute Funds for "religious, charitable, cultural, and educational purposes."

Christopher Passodelis was appointed Director. He was the driving force behind the newly formed Foundation. Mr. Passodelis began establishing the following goals in accordance with the charter. During many years, the Foundation has undertaken and spent hundreds of thousands of dollars for the following projects: schools, hospitals, scholarships, Icarian nursing home, road building, firefighting equipment, medical assistance, humanitarian aid, academic research, and to support the Pan-Icarian National Archives.

This year's Cultural Enrichment Grant, supported by the Foundation, is helping the Tsakopoulos Hellenic Collection augment its collection of books on Ikaria with 64 new acquisitions and digitize rare and unique materials already in the collection related to Ikaria and its diaspora for wide accessibility on the internet.

These acquisitions will elevate the Tsakopoulos Hellenic Collection's holdings on Ikaria to a preeminent level and enable it to become the chief repository preserving and making accessible Ikarian history and culture in the western United States.

Materials to be digitized include a rare pamphlet on the Greek communists exiled to Ikaria during the Greek Civil War, a unique historical album published around 1969 presenting the full history and accomplishments of the Pan-Icarian Brotherhood of America, and audio interviews pertaining to the life of the illustrious Greek American priest of Ikarian descent, Fr. Stephanos E. Phoutrides (1891-1946). Consisting of the holdings of the former Speros Basil Vryonis Center for the Study of Hellenism, the Tsakopoulos Hellenic Collection opened in the Visit the website below for more information: California State University Sacramento library in 2003.



The collection currently numbers some 75,000 volumes and 430 linear feet of personal and institutional archives. It is the premier Hellenic collection west of the Mississippi and one of the largest of its kind in the country. We are pleased to aid in this important endeavor to preserve our Icarian heritage!
